1. Is Prevailing Wage required?

If and after the project has been awarded, discrepancies in estimated quantities will be addressed. Complete the bid form using the estimated quantities provided.

4. What if there are additional items that need to be addressed or were missed in the scope?

Contractors may submit and are encouraged to provide additional data. See page 12, #14 Additional Data. A form for additional data has been provided on Page 7.

5. Code calls for items not listed in the scope. How will this be handled?

Again, contractors may submit and are encouraged to provide additional data that may have been overlooked. A form for additional data has been provided on Page 7.

6. What is the workmanship warranty for the project?

See page 9, #27 Workmanship. Also add, "Bidders shall provide a bid for a 5 year extension on the workmanship warranty as indicated on bid proposal form."

7. What type of material will be specified?

Shingles must be 30 year architectural and 25 year 3 tab where specified. Color will be approved by Mike Jacobson, Parks Superintendent. All products must be installed per manufacturer's specifications.

8. Page 11, #13 – Sales Tax. The County of Anoka is subject to sales tax.

9. What is the project timeline?

EXHIBIT A

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Bidders/contractors/consultants (hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor") will procure and maintain for the duration of this Agreement/Contract (hereinafter referred to as the "Contract"), insurance coverage for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work herein by the contractor, its agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. **ANOKA COUNTY CONTRACT NUMBER:** _____ .

- 1.1 **Commercial General Liability and Umbrella Liability Insurance.** Contractors will maintain Commercial General Liability (CGL) and, if necessary, commercial umbrella insurance with a limit of not less than \$2,000,000 each occurrence.
 - 1.1.1 CGL Insurance will be written on ISO occurrence form CG 00 01 96 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage), and will cover liability arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury and advertising injury, and liability assumed under an insured contract including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract.
 - 1.1.2 Anoka County, its agents, officers, directors, and employees are to be covered as an additional insured for all liability coverages using ISO additional insured endorsement CG 20 10 in combination with CG 20 37 or substitute providing equivalent coverage, and under the commercial umbrella, if any. This insurance shall apply as primary insurance with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance programs afforded to Anoka County. There will be no endorsement or modifications of the CGL to make it excess over other insurance available; alternatively, if the CGL states that it is excess or pro-rata, the policy will be endorsed to be primary with respects to the additional insured.
 - 1.1.3 Coverage as required in paragraph in 1.1 above will include Per-Project General Aggregate Limit, using ISO form CG 25 03 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage).
 - 1.1.4 The County's insurance shall be excess of the contractor's insurance and will not contribute to it. The contractor's coverage will contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the County, its agents, officers, directors, and employees.
- 1.2 **Automobile Liability and Umbrella Liability Insurance.** Contractor will maintain automobile liability and, if necessary, commercial umbrella insurance with a limit of not less than \$2,000,000 each accident.
 - 1.2.1 Automobile insurance will cover liability arising out of any auto (including owned, hired and non-owned autos). If the Contractor does not own any vehicles, Anoka County will accept hired and non-owned autos with a letter from the Contractor stating that it does not own any autos.

- 1.2.2 Coverage as required in paragraph in 1.2 above will be written on ISO form CA 00 01, or substitute form providing equivalent liability coverage. If necessary, the policy will be endorsed to provide contractual liability coverage equivalent to that provided in the 1990 and later edition of CA 00 01.
- 1.2.3 **Waiver of Subrogation.** Contractor waives all rights against Anoka County and its agents, officers, directors and employees for recovery of damages to the extent these damages are covered by the business auto liability or commercial umbrella liability insurance obtained by Contractor pursuant to Paragraph 1.2 of this Exhibit.
- 1.3 **Workers' Compensation Insurance.** Contractor will maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by the State of Minnesota and Employers Liability Insurance with a limits not less than \$2,000,000 Bodily Injury by Accident for each accident, not less than \$2,000,000 Bodily Injury By Disease each employee and not less than \$2,000,000 Bodily Injury By Disease policy limit.
- 1.3.1 Contractor waives all rights against Anoka County and its agents, officers, directors, and employees for recovery of damages to te extent these damages are covered by the Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability or Commercial Umbrella Liability Insurance obtained by Contractor pursuant to paragraph 1.3 of this agreement. Contractor will obtain an endorsement equivalent to WC 00 03 13 to affect this waiver.
- 1.4 **Builders' Risk Insurance.** – Not required for this project
- 1.5 **Other Insurance Provisions**
- 1.5.1 Prior to the start of this Contract, Contractor will furnish Anoka County with a completed copy of Anoka County's certificate of insurance form, which is attached as part of this Exhibit, or as a certificate of insurance and copies of the endorsements, executed by a duly authorized representative of each insurer, showing compliance with the insurance requirements set forth above.
- 1.5.2 All certificates will provide for 30 days written notice to Anoka County prior to the cancellation or material change of any insurance referred to in this Contract.
- 1.5.3 **No Representation of Coverage Adequacy.** By requiring insurance herein, Anoka County does not represent that coverage and limits will necessarily be adequate to

protect the Contractor and such coverage and limits shall not be deemed as a limitation on Contractor's liability under the indemnities granted to Anoka County in this Contract.

- 1.5.4 Failure of Anoka County to demand such certification or other evidence of full compliance with these insurance requirements or failure of Anoka County to identify deficiency from evidence that is provided will not be construed as a waiver of Contractor's obligation to maintain such insurance.
- 1.5.5 Failure to maintain the required insurance may result in termination of this Contract at Anoka County option.
- 1.5.6 Contractor will provide certified copies of all insurance policies required herein within 10 days of Anoka County's written request for said copies.
- 1.5.7 **Cross-Liability coverage.** If Contractor's liability does not contain the standard ISO separation of insured provision, or a substantially similar clause, they shall be endorsed to provide cross-liability coverage.
- 1.5.8 **Acceptability of Insurers.** Anoka County reserves the right to reject any insurance carriers that are rated less than: A.M. Best rating of A: IV.

**AGREEMENT FOR

THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the County of Anoka, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, Anoka County Government Center, 2100 Third Avenue, Anoka, Minnesota 55303, hereinafter referred to as the "County," and _____, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has caused bid proposals to be submitted for Anoka County Parks Re-Roofing Project For Rice Creek, Chomonix Golf Course, And Wargo Nature Center. ; and

WHEREAS, the County has awarded said bid to the Contractor.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the County and Contractor hereby enter into the following Contract:

I. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The Contract Documents consist of this Agreement; the Bidding Documents, including Information and Conditions for Bidders, Bid General Requirements, Bid Specifications, and Bid Proposal form; the Bid Proposal form submitted by Contractor; and all Addenda issued prior to and all Modifications issued after execution of this Agreement. These form the Contract and all are as fully a part of the Contract as if attached to this Agreement or repeated herein. Contractor understands that all references to "Bidder" in the Contract Documents now refer to Contractor.

II. SERVICES

Contractor hereby covenants and agrees to perform all services and provide all personnel and equipment for the price and compensation under all terms and requirements set forth and specified in the Contract Documents.

III. TERM

The work to be performed under this Agreement shall be commenced immediately upon receipt of a signed agreement; issuance of the performance bond, labor and materials bond, and certificate of insurance, and notice to proceed. Subject to authorized adjustments, Substantial Completion shall be achieved not later than as provided for in the Contract Documents.

IV. CONTRACT SUM

The Contract Sum shall be as specified in the Bid Proposal form submitted by Contractor, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

V. MODIFICATIONS

Any material alterations, modifications or variations of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable only when they have been reduced to writing as an amendment and signed by the parties.
